## The "First" Times

Just having returned from a week's long trip to Copperhill, TN. with our St. Mark youth mission team, I am filled with a joy I haven't felt for three years. In 2019, prior to my ordination, prior to my being called to St. Mark, and prior to my installation as Associate Pastor, I lead two mission teams, both which launched from a church in Brunswick, Ohio. The first was a multigenerational team that served in Ponce, Puerto Rico and the second was a High School team that served in downtown Cleveland, Ohio. In addition to these missions, I have served in Nicaragua, Cameroon, the Bahamas, and multiple other cities across the U.S.A. I provide this list not for any sort of weird twisted bragging rights, but because this sort of ministry has been a constant thread throughout my adult life and one that continues to draw me closer to others and especially closer to God. It was in fact on one mission trip to Nicaragua back in 2014 that I experienced something difficult to explain and yet so impactful that I knew beyond all doubt that my life as I knew it was about to change. Some have said that the money spent for these type of mission trips on travel, accommodations, etc would

be better used if they were sent to the mission site as a check. And In some cases, and some ways I do find that to be true. However, there is something to be said about traveling the road together, joining in a 24/7 life, and working as a team toward a common goal alongside the mission partners on the ground that cannot be experienced in any other way. At the same time as I think about the week behind me in TN., I now look with great anticipation to the week ahead in North Dakota with the St. Mark Spirit Lake mission team. 14 of us will travel to Spirit Lake North Dakota July 9th-16<sup>th</sup> to serve the local community in partnership with the Tribal Council and with our partners at Spirit Lake Ministries. Both teams will be sharing their stories with the congregation sometime in the near future. Keep your eyes and ears open for information. In the interim, feel free to ask the team members about their experiences as they will be happy to share! Reflecting on all my past mission teams and trips, I become a bit nostalgic and my heart sings anew. Names and faces run through my thoughts in rapid succession, occasionally pausing as I remember

the story that I share with that person. There is Oswald who lives in Estelí, Nicaragua with his brother Manuel and their grandmother. I remember playing my trumpet with Oswald and working alongside him as we built a brick room for their home. There is Samuel who walked me through the local Ikiliwindi market introducing me to the vendors as we visited the butcher booth, the spice booth, and the coconut oil booth. And Elizabeth who held my hand as we talked and walked on my first full day in Cameroon. There is Lamar the son of a Baptist minister who has three little dogs that he loves and cares for. And as a thank you to our team he brought us bags of lollipops on our last day in Copperhill, TN. I am passionately drawn to serve God in this way. I wonder...what has God given you a passion for? What calls you into relationship with others? What prompts you to serve and share life with another? I'd love to hear your stories!


May 23 arrived at Aberdeen Golf Club, Eureka, Missouri with a sold out event of 144 golfers, 30 plus volunteers and ideal weather with temperatures in the 70s and lots of sunshine. The event raised approximately \$32,000 with all proceeds benefiting Circle of Concern, one of several local missions supported by Saint Mark Deacons.

Saint Mark has served as the event sponsor for the past 16 years and has worked in concert with Circle staff and volunteers to create good will within the community for both entities as well as raise needed funding. The following demonstrates the direct impact Saint Mark had on this years’ tournament:

- Members funded \$12,000 in Sponsorships and Auction Items
- 18 members served as volunteers on the day of event
- 12 members participated as golfers
- 6 members served on the Golf Committee

Save, clean, and box/bag any items you wish to donate. During donation drop-off hours, drive your vehicle to the double exterior side doors to the kitchen (Martha Entrance) and a volunteer will help unload your vehicle. It's that easy! (No items will be accepted after Wednesday; thanks for helping us with this deadline.)

**Yes please:** in general, acceptable donations to the ABC sale include most items that would be sold at a garage sale or by a thrift store. Donation receipts will be available upon request during donation drop-off hours.

It's hard to say "no thank you" to a donation. Due to lack of space, safety regulations, and the inability to "unload" certain items, we are NOT able to accept:

- electronics: including televisions, computers, monitors, keyboards, their cords, CDs, tapes, etc
- large furniture items: such as sofas, love seats, large entertainment centers, dining sets, mattresses (if it doesn't fit in a small SUV, we can't accept it)
- encyclopedias or magazines
- car seats, high chairs, car seats, or cribs
- Christmas trees
- hazardous waste (even if unopened): such as paint, chemicals, oil, household cleaning supplies
- *not sure???* – contact one of the ABC Sale Co-Chairs and we'll quickly get you an answer!
