SESSION SNIPPETS

Notes from the March 27, 2023 Session Meeting:

Session revisited St. Mark's Credo—SEEK, DISCOVER, SHARE, and discussed the objectives and goals that were identified in 2021 and 2022. How are we doing? That covers everything from Bible study (Friday and Sunday mornings, plus PW Circles, Small Groups, etc.), to Food Truck Fridays and Fall Festival and lots of Mission initiatives. In the coming months there will be conversation about what 2023 will "look like" during Pastor Dave's Sabbatical, summer programs and mission trips, and the Food Packing event plus looking ahead for five years. It's an exciting time for St. Mark.

- Maundy Thursday Communion begins a return to coming forward to be served, following appropriate processes to address safety concerns.
- The Library is changing! Note the relocation to the previous Parish Associate's Office, books on display in the Narthex to take home for personal use and other changes. It's a work in progress. More to come...
- New "Owl" cameras will be installed in Rm 102 to provide better technology for "hybrid" meetings.

PER CAPITA 2023




YOUTH WEDNESDAYS 6 - 7 pm

LENT WATER CHALLENGE - CLEAN WATER IS VITAL TO HEALTH

- \$450 builds a well in a rural Sub-Saharan Africa village
 - each well provides a safe, sustainable source of clean drinking water for about 125 men, women, and children
 - every \$1 invested in basic drinking water, an average of nearly \$7 is returned in saved medical costs and increased
- 50% of hospital admissions in Sub-Saharan Africa are because of water-borne disease
 - Sub-Saharan Africa has the highest under-age 5 mortality rate in the world, 15 times higher than in high income countries

Pastor Dave has encouraged his congregations for the past 15 years to drink only clean tap water for the 40 days of Lent and donate the money not spent on other beverages to support the building of clean water wells in Africa. Giving up the morning trip to our favorite coffee spot, or the beverage with our drive through meal, or the evening adult beverage, will help us comprehend how much money we spend on beverages.

We are blessed to have clean water in our community, and this challenge helps us to understand the needs of those who have less, and support groups who are working to provide living water for all God's children.
