#### CHARITABLE GIVING TO ST. MARK Wills and Trust Bequests and Beneficiary Designations for Charitable Giving

Early each year is a good time to review and update you wills, trusts and any of your beneficiary designations. Think back to what has changed in your life over the past year and if these documents are still consistent with your desires. Has your family expanded or have family members passed away; have you divorced, remarried, have a significant other, or now single; and how is your family structure now different.

Although these types of future gifts may not provide immediate benefit to St. Mark and cannot be used to meet your pledge, they can provide a significant gift to St. Mark. These gifts are made by including a designation in your will or trust documents assigning St. Mark to receive a specific portion of your estate at your passing. You can also include St. Mark as a beneficiary on your IRAs and other retirement plans. St. Mark receives these gifts at your death, at which time your estate or other beneficiaries may benefit from reductions of income and estate taxes.

Always consult your financial planner, estate planning attorney, or tax professional to review the benefits to you and your family for this type of future giving to St. Mark.

#### CIRCLE OF CONCERN 17th ANNUAL CHARITY GOLF TOURNAMENT

St. Mark Deacons will once again serve as the sponsor for the Circle of Concern Golf Tournament to be held May 22, 2023 at the Aberdeen Golf Club, Eureka, Missouri. Enjoy 18 holes of golf on a beautiful links style course with a picturesque backdrop of the Meramec River bluffs. Complete with a light breakfast, assorted beverages, hot dogs, and a catered meal following golf with awards and auction. Last year's tournament raised \$29,000 with all proceeds directly benefitting the Circle. Orthopedic Specialists is again the Presenting Sponsor. Additionally, Saint Mark families throughout the 17 years have been leading financial sponsors.

Circle of Concern located in Valley Park, Missouri assists 650 low-income families on a monthly basis within the footprint of the Parkway, Rockwood and Valley Park school districts and parts of Fenton. Primarily a food pantry, Circle shares wholesome foods, personal care items, and other necessities, as well as short-term emergency financial assistance to eligible households. Circle also invests in the future of its clients through coaching, counseling, career mentorship programs, college and trade school scholarships, and children's programs.

The journey through the **YOUR**Gospel of Mark continues in March. This is a fantastic 🔰 opportunity to read through the earliest gospel with others and to explore



## LENTEN WATER CHALLENGE

- More children are killed by unsafe water than by bullets
- Globally, at least 2 billion people use contaminated water
- 50% of hospital admissions in Sub-Saharan Africa are because of water-borne disease
- In Sub-Saharan Africa, women spend 16 million hours EVERY DAY carrying water

Pastor Dave has encouraged his congregations for the past 15 years to drink only clean tap water for the 40 days of Lent and donate the money not spent on other beverages to support the building of clean water wells in Africa. Giving up the morning trip to our favorite coffee spot, or the beverage with our drive through meal, or the evening adult beverage, will help us comprehend how much money we spend on beverages. We are blessed to have clean water in our community, and this challenge helps us to understand the needs of those who have less, and support groups who are working to provide living water for all God's children.
