GIVING TO ST. MARK

The Finance Committee wants to continue to provide insights for various ways to provide financial support to St. Mark and the missions of our church.

One often misunderstood way to give is by using your IRA (excluding active SEP-IRAs and active SIMPLE-IRAs) for a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD's). Beginning at the day you turn age 70½ (not the new age 73 for Required Minimum Distribution), you may be able to use your IRA for giving to St. Mark.

Each individual can exclude **up to \$100,000 of QCDs** from their Gross Income each year and avoid taxation on those amounts. This exclusion from gross income may be a tax efficient way for taxpayers who would not itemize deductions. Be sure to have your IRA custodian make the distribution *directly* from your IRA to a qualified charity (i.e.: St. Mark).

Always consult your financial planner, estate planning attorney, or tax professional to review the benefits to you and your family for using this strategy of giving.

REMEMBER TO SAVE THE DATES!

It's May and our ABC Sale will be upon us in just a few months! It's time to get into those attics, basements and closets, and clean out those items you want to donate this year.

We'll be accepting drop-offs at St Mark beginning Sunday, July 30th after the 10am service until 4pm, and Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, July 31st, August 1-2nd from 8am to Noon; no drop-offs will be accepted on Thursday, August 3rd. The sale days are Friday, August 4th and Saturday, August 5th. We'll open early on Friday (7am) to those who want to get a jump on the bargains (and are willing to pay \$10); regular sale hours will be 8am to Ipm on Friday, and 8am to Noon on Saturday. We'll accept clothing (all ages and sizes), toys, books, puzzles, small household items, gardening equipment, tools, sports equipment, holiday items, and luggage. As a gentle reminder, we are NOT able to accept electronics, large-scale furniture items, baby cribs, highchairs, car seats, entertainment centers and mattresses. But we will provide information on other options for recycling those items in an upcoming communication.

Events like this need lots of volunteers: set-up, greeters, cashiers, help in each of the departments, clean-up and so forth. 

WHAT'S HAPPENING **WITH YOUTH**






YOUTH MISSION TRIP, JUNE 11-17 Pray for our St. Mark youth mission team and for the communities we will encounter! Pastor MP



Constitutional Requirements for Elders: Presbyterian Church USA Book of Order:
Those persons who will hold this office ought to be sound in their faithpersons of wisdom and discretionpray with and for the peopleoversee the spiritual interest of the church. (Paraphrased)
Responsibilities of St. Mark Session Elders include regular attendance at stated meetings (usually the third Monday of the month) and any specially called meetings, serving as a chairperson or active member of a Session standing committee, and assisting with the Lord's Supper. Three year term*.
For Elder, I suggest:
Constitutional Requirements for Deacons: Presbyterian Church USA Book of Order: The office of Deacon is one of sympathy, witness, and servicetheir duties should be to minister to those who are in need, to the sick, to the friendless and to any who may be in distress. (Paraphrased)
Responsibilities of St. Mark Board of Deacons include regular attendance at stated meetings (first Monday of the month) and any specially called meetings, serving as chairperson or active member of a Deacons committee, visitation and delivery of altar flowers, and assisting with the Lord's Supper. Three year term*.
For Deacon, I suggest:

<u>Constitutional Requirements for Congregational Nominating Committee</u> : Presbyterian Church USA Book of Order: This committee should be representative of the congregation and include two members from the Session; one from the Board of Deacons; and a majority chosen from the congregation-at-large (five At St. Mark). (Paraphrased)
Responsibilities of St. Mark Congregational Nominating Committee includes regular attendance at called meetings (3-4 per year), appreciation for the demands of the respective offices, and a wide knowledge of the St. Mark membership and a willingness to increase this knowledge. One year term*.
For the Congregational Nominating Committee, I suggest:
*St. Mark bylaws also provide one, one-year term for an active member who is under 25 years of age, for each of the following: Elder, Deacon, and Congregational Nominating Committee.
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Constitutional Requirements for the Endowment Committee
Persons should be active members of the congregation.
Responsibilities of St. Mark Endowment Committee include keeping the congregation apprised of the possibilities for deferred giving, provide assistance to members with how this may be done and management of the endowment fund. Four year term.
For the Endowment Committee, I suggest:
