The sunny hot days will fade away, and the fall colors will soon arrive. "Not yet!" you say but "Soon" says Fall. Summer bids us "Enjoy the summer days!' Ecclesiastes bids us "Enjoy the changing times." God bids us "enjoy the days you have been created for!"



PARTNERSHIP WITH THE AMERICAN RED CROSS

St Mark Presbyterian Church is proud to partner with the American Red Cross and be a part of all they do for our community. Our blood drive is important to patients in need, but the collection and distribution of blood is just a small part of all the Red Cross does. The enormity of what the Red Cross accomplishes every day is astounding and this is one of the reasons we chose them as one of our core community outreach partners.

Every hour of the day, more than 1,200 people in America are assisted by the American Red Cross. More than 17,000 people every day receive lifesaving Red Cross health and safety training. Every day, the Red Cross provides more than 1,100 services to military members, their families and veterans. About 170 times a day, Red Cross workers help families affected by a home fire or other disaster.

From a blood supply standpoint:

The Red Cross – needs to collect more than 13,000 blood donations and more than 2,500 platelet donations each day.

The blood collected by the Red Cross helps millions of patients in over -2,500 hospitals and other facilities across the country.

84 percent of blood donations are given at blood drives - hosted by generous sponsoring organizations like ours.

At **St Mark Presbyterian Church**, we are proud to hold blood drives every quarter in partnership with the Red Cross, giving us all an opportunity to make a difference.
