Most fathers are bound by a commitment to do the best they can for their children. Serving families and fathers, like Samuel, is what Presbyterian Children's Homes and Services does.


CONGREGATIONAL MEETING


Sunday school for children PreK - 5th grade takes place during Sunday worship, immediately following the Children's Message.
