Always consult your financial planner, estate planning attorney, or tax professional to review the benefits to you and your family for using this strategy for giving.




Nursery Care, for ages 0 - 2yrs, is available Sunday mornings from 8:30 - 11:00 am.

ST. MARK BLOOD DRIVE

The American Red Cross is experiencing a national blood shortage.

Back-to-school season, summer travel & an already active hurricane season have hindered blood donations, resulting in a shortfall of about 30,000 blood donations in August alone. Right now, blood product distributions to hospitals are outpacing the number of blood donations coming in. The Red Cross is working with hospitals around the clock to meet the blood needs of patients – but can't do it alone. We need your help!

Blood shortages can affect people with all needs for blood. September was Sickle Cell Awareness and Pediatric Cancer Awareness Month, both of which required significant support from blood donors to ensure the blood products needed are readily available. The blood collected at our blood drive, is already earmarked to help someone in need. Please help us fill our schedules to help ensure all those suffering receive critical medical care.
