Dan Forrest's work ranges from small choral works to instrumental solo works, wind ensemble works, and extended multi-movement works for chorus and orchestra. His Requiem for the Living (2013) and Jubilate Deo (2016) have become standard choral/orchestral repertoire for ensembles around the world, with the Requiem receiving over 1000 performances around the world, and LUX (2018) and the breath of life (2020) also receiving critical acclaim.

Dan holds a doctorate in composition and a master's degree in piano performance, and served for several years as a professor and department head (music theory and composition) in higher education. He currently serves as Editor at Beckenhorst Press, Chair of the American Choral Director's Association Composition Initiatives Committee, adjunct Faculty at Furman University, and Artist-In-Residence at Mitchell Road Presbyterian Church (Greenville, SC). 


FRIDAY MORNING BIBLE STUDY


Sunday school for children PreK - 5th grade takes place during Sunday worship, immediately following the Children's Message.
