Common Lies and Better Truths

My heart is full of thanks as I sit down to write this message to you all on a cloudy and grey Wednesday afternoon. I am grateful for our time together through our seasons of stewardship, Advent, and Christmas. I am also excited about all the exciting things happening at St. Mark as we begin 2024 together. We will begin an all-church book read of "Lies My Preacher Told Me" this Sunday during our education hour. This II-week journey will conclude right before Holy Week begins and each chapter is easy to read and digest.

I saw this book in one of the reading rooms at Montreat Conference Center in North Carolina this summer during my sabbatical, and the title caught my eye. It explores common misconceptions about the Old Testament and provides ways we can engage the text faithfully. I think it is important to note most pastors are not intentionally lying to their congregations, and the author

Too often, clergy (and other well-meaning Christians) pass along information they are certain is in scripture but it's a mistruth they picked up along the way. Mark Twain writes, "History is strewn thick with evidence that a truth is not hard to kill, but a lie, well told, is immortal."

Many scholars consider this a "Post Truth" era in the American political, economic, and social arenas. Some use alternative facts to make their points while others use moral relativism to justify all kinds of actions. Public confidence is at an all-time low in many of our institutions like government and journalism. The Christian church is not immune to this (and it shouldn't be) as the rise of the religiously unaffiliated, often called "the nones", continues. I believe our best response to this is to return to God's Word. Dr. Thomas Gillespie was the president of Princeton Theological Seminary during my time there, and he said one thing I'll never forget. "I want you to know the scriptures as well as the Bible College students, but

better." Some might reduce this to to memorizing chapter and verse, but I believe there's a whole lot more to what Dr. Gillespie shared. We need to know the Word, the original context, and, most importantly, ways we can put it into practice faithfully.

I encourage you to join us on Sunday mornings at 8:50 AM in Room 102 and online as we explore this book together. We'll cover a lot of it during worship, but this class allows for a healthy give-and-take as we discuss each one of the author's claims. There are books available for purchase in the office or you can purchase it online. I am excited about this new journey together, and I cannot wait to be in the Word with you all in 2024.

DEACONS IN ACTION AT ST. MARK


The donation of sanctuary flowers is a wonderful way for our members to honor loved ones and commemorate special events during the year, while, at the same time, helping to beautify our church. During our most holy seasons, Easter and Christmas, members can purchase Easter Lilies and Poinsettias. Provided as a donation, these flowers and plants also serve to bring joy to a church member who cannot attend church. This often includes a visit by one of our deacons, allowing homebound members and members in senior living to stay in touch with our church family and to know that they are thought of, appreciated, and loved. All plants purchased can also be designated to be taken home or delivered personally to whomever the member chooses. During 2023:

- A total of 46 sanctuary bouquets were ordered from a local florist of which 27 of these were donated and were delivered by the deacons to homebound members and 19 were taken home by the donors.
- For the Easter season, 28 families donated a total of 58 Easter lilies which were ordered from a local greenhouse for our sanctuary on Easter Sunday. After the Easter service 47 were delivered by deacons to homebound members and 14 were taken home by the donors.
- For the Christmas season, 26 families donated a total of 74 poinsettia plants which were ordered from a local greenhouse for our sanctuary during the Christmas Eve services. Afterwards 59 plants were delivered to homebound members and two residential care facilities, and 15 plants were taken home by the donor.


ST. MARK MEN'S BIBLE STUDY

CHILDREN'S SUNDAY SCHOOL


Sunday school for children $PreK - 5^{th}$ grade takes place during Sunday worship, immediately following the Children's Message.


