April will be Earth Care Month at St. Mark. Open your ears to hear that theme...in worship, Christian education, the Water Challenge Celebration, during the Wednesday Night Potluck class, and plenty of other places.

PENTECOST SPECIAL OFFERING

The Pentecost "season" for the Special Offering, begins April I and is completed on Pentecost Sunday, May 19, when we will welcome our 2024 Confirmation Class into "membership" at St. Mark. The red paraments, stoles, balloons, and a lot of hoopla appears. It is a time of celebration.

This offering is structed to serve the needs of children at risk and young adults. Forty percent of the offering is retained by St. Mark and will be distributed to Presbyterian Childrens' Home and Services and to Isaiah 58 for their Back-to-School Backpack program. The remaining portion that goes to the Presbyterian Mission Agency is devoted to ministries with youth and young adults and working with child advocacy for children at risk.

Think of how fortunate our own children and young adults are and the challenges for so many others. Be generous in your gifts. The envelope is in your April packet or just specify "Pentecost" on the memo line of your check to St. Mark Presbyterian. Your generosity is appreciated.

ADDITIONAL WAYS TO GIVE TO ST. MARK

In addition to giving cash and checks, there are many different ways to give to St. Mark. As April 15th is fast approaching, we wanted to provide updates on two topics that may be appropriate for your future tax planning on charitable giving.

I. Gifting from your IRA:

If you are age $70\frac{1}{2}$ or older at the time of the gift, you may want to consider a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from your traditional IRA or inherited IRA (other than active SEP-IRAs and active SIMPLE-IRAs). IRAs may be the best asset for you to give to charity as they are loaded with taxes. You must direct your IRA custodian to make a distribution directly from your IRA to a gualified charity (i.e.: St. Mark), and the distribution must be one that would otherwise be taxable to you. You can now exclude up to \$105,000 of QCDs to one or more charitable organizations from your Gross Income each year, thereby avoiding taxation on those amounts. If you file a married filing jointly tax return, each spouse can now exclude up to \$105,000 of QCDs. The exclusion from gross income for QCDs may also provide other taxefficient ways for taxpayers who don't itemize deductions to make charitable contributions and may also provide you additional tax benefits, credits and deductions.

2. Using a Donor-Advised Fund:

Established as a separate account, a Donor Advised Fund (DAF) allows you to make irrevocable contributions and possibly take an itemized tax deduction from your federal tax return. This can work extremely well should you have investments (outside of your retirement accounts) that have increased significantly in value, creating an opportunity for a suitable charitable contribution. You may be able to contribute cash, current stock and other securities, privately held business interests, and other non-publicly traded assets. Your contribution is then invested in the DAF as you desire and has the potential to grow. Many DAFs provide a variety of investment options from which you can select an investment strategy for your charitable dollars. At that point you can request grants over time to any IRS-qualified public charity. DAFs can be used to support your individual strategic giving and continue to strengthen a philanthropic legacy, which might include St. Mark.

Always consult your financial planner or tax professional to confirm that a Qualified Charitable Distribution or a Donor-Advised Fund is appropriate for you.

Circle of Concern located in Valley Park, Missouri assists 650 low-income families monthly within the footprint of the Parkway, Rockwood and Valley Park school districts and parts of Fenton and Kirkwood. Primarily a food pantry, Circle shares wholesome foods, personal care items, and other necessities, as well as short-term emergency financial assistance to eligible households. Circle also invests in the future of its clients through coaching, counseling, career mentorship programs, college and trade school scholarships, and children's programs.

Hopefully, you may be asking, "What can I do to help?" Please consider the following options:
