
ADULT CHRISTIAN EDUCATION AT ST. MARK

The Third Day: Living the Resurrection

On the third day, he rose again. In "The Third Day: Living the Resurrection", Tom Berlin uses his gifts of storytelling and understanding the Scriptures to connect the reader to the experiences of several individuals around Jesus in his final days, focusing on new life and redemption rather than loss. This study traces events around these characters, along with Paul and the disciples at Emmaus, and how the resurrection transforms their lives.






SAVE THE DATE: ST. MARK OUTING TO MOUND RIDGE, MAY 3-4
