Fall has arrived, there's a crispness in the morning air; the holiday season is upon us! The Fellowship Committee wants everyone to mark their calendars for St. Mark's annual **GIVING THANKS** dinner on **Sunday, November 24**, immediately after the worship service. Please join us as we all gather together to, share in fellowship, good conversation and laughter while enjoying a traditional Thanksgiving dinner with one another. We invite you to bring your favorite dessert to share...we'll take care of everything else!

As we reflect on our blessings, we realize that many of our neighbors are not as fortunate. This year, we are seeking to stock the shelves at Circle of Concern and Isaiah 58 with items that are frequently asked for, but surprisingly rarely donated for holiday meals. The following list of items will give people the opportunity to select ingredients for them to make some of their most treasured dishes: canned yams/sweet potatoes, canned spinach, shortening, baking soda, baking powder, vanilla extract, chocolate chips, cooking/baking spices (chili powder, paprika, black pepper, garlic and onion powders, cinnamon), baking mixes (cookies, cakes, brownies, quick breads). All donations can be placed on the tables located in the lobby outside the church office.
