As I prepare to leave, I take comfort in remembering that God is not bound by geography. We are still part of the same body, held by the same Spirit, guided by the same grace. And while our time walking side by side is coming to a close, the impact you've had on my life will continue to unfold. You will always have a special place in my heart.

So, as June 15th approaches, I am looking forward to celebrating together the good work we have done, the good memories we've made, and the good future that God continues to prepare for us both.

Keep being the kind of church that welcomes all, serves boldly, and loves well. Keep trusting in God's plan. Keep lifting one another up. And know that I will be doing the same.

SESSION SNIPPETS

April 28 Meeting

Rev. MP started the Session meeting with a reading from the 40-Day Devotional, and from the Luke Chapter 22 description of the first Maundy Thursday. We discussed what role the pulpit and communion table play in our life and ministry at St. Mark.

For the upcoming Pentecost offering, we voted to distribute the 40% of the offering retained by St. Mark equally to Presbyterian Children's Home and Services, and to Isaiah 58 for their back-to-school backpack program. The General Assembly uses the rest of the offering on programs that support youth.

The Session voted to approve a proposal from the Property Committee to use funds from the Endowment to complete much needed repairs on two of the flat sections of the St. Mark roof, over the office and over the technology area in the sanctuary. These areas of roofing are well past their service life, and replacement will prevent recurrence of leaks and water damage.

The Deacons held a very successful Blood Drive on 27 April, with 32 donors providing 37 units of blood. Collections of food and personal hygiene products for Circle of Concern and Isaiah 58 continue at the table in the foyer, and future projects include St. Mark Support for the Circle of Concern Golf Tournament on May 19, and the Rise Against Hunger project on June 21.


MEN'S BIBLE STUDY


