Have You Ever Wondered?

I listened to a podcast recently where the host opined it's easier than ever to acquire information, but it's more difficult to interpret it. This comment rattled around in my brain over the last several days, and I think there is a lot of truth to it. There was a time, not that long ago, when if you had a question, you would need to ask a teacher, a parent, or a trusted expert to provide the facts. It was a process, and it required dialogue to ascertain the answer. Nowadays, it's a speedy search on the phone, a quick question to a smart speaker, or a short query to an artificial intelligence site. It's easy to get an answer, but it's hard to acquire the truth. It's hard to navigate a world of wishy-washy wisdom, half-baked truths, and full-on lies.

I once had a youth group student in California who attended a different church one Tuesday night. I was worried about this because they were the biggest congregation in the area and had a habit of pinching kids from other faith communities. I was relieved when she returned to our group the next week. I asked her how she liked the other group, and she responded, "It was fine, but the youth pastor didn't allow anyone to ask any questions." She loved our smaller group because we participated in discussion every week. This desire for dialogue doesn't end in our childhood, but it is oftentimes absent in our adult years.

St. Mark is offering a month-long course in August on getting **Back to the Basics**. Whether you are new to the faith or a "Cradle Presbyterian", this class is designed for you. There are many questions we are afraid to ask because we feel like we should have learned everything years ago. In the back of our heads, we think we missed the Sunday school class that would have provided all the answers. This class will cover the history of the Bible, the essentials of the Christian faith, the distinctives of the Reformed Tradition, and so much more. It's an opportunity to ask questions and participate in a meaningful dialogue. It will meet for an hour before worship each Sunday in August, and it is open to all. As always, the church will provide childcare for anyone who needs it.

I am excited about this opportunity, and I hope you will join us. You can also email me questions ahead of time, and I am happy to address them in the class.

Approved a motion from Fellowship to schedule an outdoor Concert on August 8, featuring Mark Reynoso's jazz quartet.


