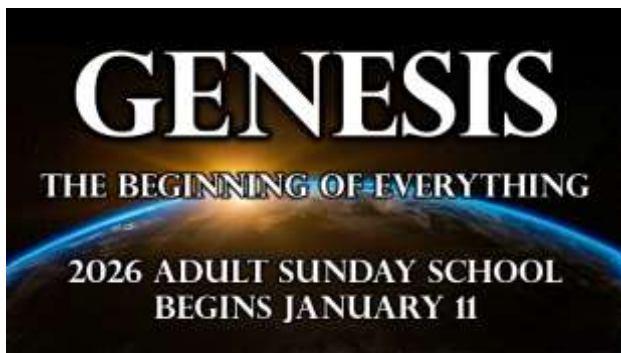
ADULT CHRISTIAN EDUCATION AT ST. MARK

THE HEIDELBERG CATECHISM

The Heidelberg Catechism was published in 1563 and was soon accepted by Reformed churches throughout Europe. It is designed to provide instruction for young people, give a pastoral guide for preaching, and shape a faith that is lived, not just learned.

The questions and answers are divided into 52 Lord's Day sections, and we will be using them as our Affirmation of Faith throughout 2026. Over the course of this year, we will cover the essentials of the Christian faith and look at practical applications for our lives.

You can access a Heidelberg Catechism Q&A page with footnotes for each week in the bulletin (if space is available) and on the Worship page at discoverstmark.org. All are encouraged to ponder the questions ahead of each service.
