Have you ever considered mission work to be a reflection of the heart of God? Throughout scripture we see a God who reaches out, who seeks the lost. When the church engages in missions—whether across the world or across the street—it is joining in God’s work.

Mission work keeps the church outward-focused. It is easy for any congregation to become inward-looking, concentrating only on internal needs and preferences.

Missions lift our eyes beyond our own walls and comfort zones. This work challenges us to see the needs of others: the spiritually lost, the materially poor, the lonely, the displaced, and the hurting. In serving them, the church lives out Jesus’ command to love our neighbors as ourselves.

Mission work strengthens the faith of the church. When believers step out to serve, pray, give, and go, they depend on God in fresh ways.

Changed lives, prayers answered, and doors opened build confidence in God’s power and faithfulness. Even those who never travel far can participate through prayer, generosity, and encouragement, and they too are blessed as they witness what God is doing.

Encountering different cultures and struggles helps believers appreciate the global family of God and recognize how much they themselves have received. **Mission work grows humility, gratitude, and compassion.**

SESSION SNIPPETS

January 26 Session Meeting:

The Session and Deacons held their annual joint Meeting on January 26. The Property Committee reported on their progress getting qualified bids for the Sanctuary and Narthex lighting upgrades funded by the Capital Campaign. Session approved funding and authorized the Property Committee to award the contract to the most favorable bidder.

- Session approved a request from the Youth Committee to allow adult trivia contest participants to bring alcoholic beverages to be consumed at the event on February 28. Committees and individuals were encouraged to donate gift baskets for the silent auction.
- Session approved a request from the Property Committee to use Endowment funds to replace the HVAC system over the office and Pastors' hallway. The current system is increasingly difficult and expensive to maintain.
- The Deacons volunteered to host a Pot Luck Dinner on March 18, and Communications will host April 15. There will not be a Pot Luck in February.
- A part-time transitional pre-school leader is now in place, and the Pre-School committee and staff are working well together to plan a path forward to permanently fill leadership roles.


Grief Support

The goal of the Grief Support is to support the congregation and the community through their grief journey. We offer GriefShare, a thirteen-week program to help people navigate the emotional journey of grief after losing a loved one. In addition, we offer the annual program, Surviving the Holidays.
