Comfort, Guilt, Grace, and Gratitude

The adult Sunday school class recently completed a four-month journey through the Presbyterian Church's Book of Confessions. We discussed the history, theology, and implication of every affirmation, confession, creed, and catechism. It is so important to understand these foundational documents and to seek to live out their truths in our daily walk. One of the most meaningful discussions centered on the Heidelberg Catechism. The document was published in 1563 and was soon accepted by Reformed churches throughout Europe. It is designed to provide instruction for young people, give a pastoral guide for preaching, and shape a faith that is lived, not just learned.

The questions and answers are divided into 52 Lord's Day sections, and we will be using them as our Affirmation of Faith throughout 2026. Over the course of this year, we will cover the essentials of the Christian faith and look at practical applications for our lives. Throughout my nearly 24 years of ministry, I recognize we all have questions we are afraid to ask. Everyone feels like there was one Sunday school class they missed that would have provided all the answers. Heidelberg provides a clear explanation of God's plan for salvation.

The catechism begins with a familiar question, "What is your only comfort in life and in death?" It then moves to discussions on Guilt, Grace, and Gratitude. I am excited to begin this yearlong journey with you all on January 4, 2026, and I encourage you to ponder the questions ahead of each service. This is the heart of the Reformed confessional tradition, and I look forward to learning/relearning it together.
